EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-30 Series of 2020

MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MGCQ) IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BAUANG, LA UNION.

WHEREAS, Proclamation 922 placed the entire country under National Health Emergency due to COVID-19 and enjoined all government agencies and local government units to render full assistance and cooperation, and mobilize the necessary resources to undertake critical, urgent and appropriate responses and measures to curtail and eliminate the COVID-19 threat;

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte placed the entire Luzon under Enhanced Community Quarantine by virtue of Proclamation 929 and ordered all local government units down to the barangays to actively and strictly impose directives from the national government;

WHEREAS, RA No. 11469 or the Bayanihan to Heal As One Act recognizes the serious threat of the pandemic to the health, safety, security and lives of our countrymen, and the severe disruption of economic activities;

WHEREAS, the AITF-EID issued the "Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines", under Resolution No. 30, dated April 29, 2020, Series of 2020 while the DTI consequently issued additional guidelines/clarifications for businesses establishments/activities;

WHEREAS, the Province La Union was identified by the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Disease (IATF-EID) as a moderate-risk and low-risk administrative area where General Community Quarantine (GCQ) will be implemented starting May 1, 2020;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Government forwarded a request to the Regional Task Force I on COVID-19 to extend the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) in the Province of La Union which the MIATF unconditionally supported duly concurred by the Sangguniang Bayan Resolution No. 227, Series of 2020, recognizing the need for a continuing enforcement of stricter measures and schemes in the midst of uncertainties brought about by limited medical testing, supplies and facilities in the municipality and even in the province of La Union;

WHEREAS, the March 18, 2020 Memorandum from the Office of the Executive Secretary directed all Local Government Units and other national agencies including

universities and colleges to adopt, coordinate, and implement guidelines which the IATF may issue on the COVID-19 situation, consistent with the respective agency mandates and relevant, laws, rules and regulations;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the General Welfare Clause of the Local Government Code of 1991 gives local government units the authority to exercise powers necessary for efficient and effective governance and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, the IATF in its meeting held last May 15, 2020 provided for the Omnibus Guidelines on the implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines;

WHEREAS, IATF Resolution No. 40 dated May 27, 2020 classified the province of La Union as a low-risk province and placed it under MGCQ or Modified General Community Quarantine until June 15, 2020 without prejudice to the declaration of localized Enhanced Community Quarantine in critical areas;

WHEREAS, the Department of Tourism issued MC No. 2020-002 known as "Community Quarantine Guidelines for Hotel Operations";

WHEREAS, IATF Resolution No. 41, Series of 2020 dated May 29, 2020 provides for the gradual re-opening of salons and barbershops under GCQ and MGCQ areas;

WHEREAS, there is a need to provide implementing guidelines on the implementation of the transitional community quarantine classification or MGCQ imposed in the municipality of Bauang, La Union for the period June 1-15, 2020;

WHEREAS, in consideration of the premises set forth herein, the following implementing guidelines are crafted to guide the public and private sector, and all residents of Bauang, La Union, as to their conduct under Modified General Community Quarantine;

NOW THEREFORE, I, MENCHIE C. LOMBOY-DE GUZMAN, M.D., Municipal Mayor, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE. Modified General Community Quarantine or MGCQ is hereby imposed in all the thirty-nine (39) barangays of the Municipality of Bauang starting June 1-15, 2020, in accordance with IATF Resolution No. 40, Series of 2020.

The MGCQ shall serve as the transition phase between GCQ and New Normal by relaxing temporary measures on limiting movement and transportation, regulation of operating industries, and the presence of uniformed personnel to enforce community quarantine protocols, to become less necessary.

The implementing guidelines for the Modified General Community Quarantine imposed in the Municipality of Bauang is hereby adopted to guide all concerned towards transition to the new normal characterized by emerging behaviours, situations, minimum health standards and policies even after the pandemic.

SECTION 2. ON TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS. All persons within the Municipality of Bauang are now allowed outside their residence starting June 1 to June 15, 2020, subject to provisions under this order and quarantine guidelines and protocols issued by appropriate government agencies.

IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES:

1. Curfew from 8:00 PM – 5:00 AM provided under earlier orders shall remain enforced. The curfew shall be applicable to non-workers only.
2. Travels for accessing basic, essential and allowed services and activities outside the barangay shall still be subject to issuance of Barangay Pass Slips (BPS) using reasonable schemes that may be adopted by the barangay to ensure compliance with quarantine laws and social distancing.
3. Every household shall be entitled to (2) Barangay Pass Slips (BPS) weekly for accessing essential and basic needs. One household member per barangay pass slip. Other barangay pass slips may be issued for reasonable and allowed trips and activities upon the discretion of the barangay captain.
4. Inter-Zonal as well as Inter-Provincial and Inter-Regional movements are subject to Travel Authority that may be required by concerned authorities.
5. Inter-municipal movements are subject to Municipal Checkpoints established by the PNP.
6. Upon request, Medical Certificates, Health Declaration, Quarantine Certificates are available at the Municipal Health Office (MHO) or RHU.
7. Upon application, Work Pass and other quarantine travel documents are available at the Mayor's Office thru the Office of the Municipal Administrator.
8. Travels of government officials and personnel across borders shall be covered by corresponding Travel Orders.

SECTION 3. PUBLIC GATHERINGS. Public gatherings identified below shall be allowed in accordance to existing guidelines and protocols.

1. Movie screenings
2. Concerts
3. Sporting events
4. Other entertainment activities
5. Community assemblies
6. Government-initiated meetings
7. Religious gatherings (i.e. Funeral services for PUIs and non-PUIs, mass celebration, bible studies),
8. Blood donations
9. non-essential work gatherings

GUIDELINES/CONDITIONS:

1. Participants shall be limited to 50% of the venue or seating capacity
2. Strict social distancing or strict maintenance of at least (1) meter between and among those attending.
3. Mandatory wearing of facemask
4. Provision of sanitation area (alcohol/sanitizers/wash area)
5. Observation of symptoms or thermal scanning
6. Engineering controls such as social distancing markings and separate entrance and exit
7. Observance of the above during the entirety of the event

SECTION 4. OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES. The following activities shall be allowed provided that minimum public health standards shall be strictly enforced, as appropriate.

1. Individual outdoor exercises like jogging, biking, hiking, swimming, etc.
2. Group outdoor exercises such as zumba and the like
3. Non-contact sports such as golf, table tennis, badminton, etc.
4. Water sports such as swimming
5. Grape-picking (subject to the general guidelines provided under this order on opening and operation of establishments-Section 5)

SECTION 5. SERVICE OFFICES AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS OPERATION. Offices, establishments or individuals conducting or providing activities

or services that are newly allowed to operate/work under MGCQ, subject to the following general and specific conditions.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR OPENING AND OPERATION:

1. Attendance to a training on public health standards conducted by the Municipal Health Office, see official FB page for schedules;
2. Compliance with issuances and guidelines on Minimum Public Health Standards;
3. Provision of Sanitation Desk at entrances;
4. Provision of alternative arrangements for persons who are sixty (60) years old and above, those with immune-deficiency, co-morbidities, or other health risks, and pregnant women.

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES:

1. **ACCOMMODATION ESTABLISHMENTS** like hotels, resorts, apartment hotels, tourist inns, motels, pension houses, private homes used for homestay, bed and breakfast and others operating primarily for accommodation purposes
 - a. Secure "Certificate of Authority to Operate" prior to any operation for both accommodation of guests or operation of in-house food facilities for take-out or delivery services by submitting a Letter of Intent to DOT.
 - b. For non-DOT accredited accommodation establishments, submit a duly accomplished application for DOT accreditation with complete supporting documents.
 - c. Limited operations at 50% operational capacity to accommodate guests whether for work or leisure purposes.
 - d. Limited operations at 50% operational capacity for ancillary establishment within the premises such as restaurants, cafes, bars, gyms, spas, and the like.
 - e. Maintain a skeleton force which may or may not comprise of In House Staff.
 - f. Comply with reporting requirements to DOT for checked-in guests and acceptance of food orders for take-out and delivery.
 - g. Guests must complete a health declaration form about their health status and travel history.
 - h. Provide guests with information on COVID19, how to reduce risk of contraction, proper sanitation and disinfection measures and emergency numbers.

- i. Regular sanitation and disinfection on rooms and all general facilities and furnishings.
- j. Development of a preparedness action plan to effectively manage cases and mitigate impact among clients and staff.

2. RESTAURANTS

- a. Limited operations at 50% operational capacity.
- b. Regular sanitation schedule and procedures (10-minute interval of sanitation in between customers dining-in is required)
- c. Availability of alternative methods of ordering and picking up of orders (on-line, via text).
- d. Health checklist given to customers which includes spaces for name and contact details in case of contact-tracing becomes necessary
- e. Properly sanitized tables and chairs at least one meter apart on all sides
- f. Visible floor markings for guidance of clients in queuing
- g. Proper ventilation in the establishment
- h. Visible and accessible sanitizing equipment and tools
- i. Observance of proper personal hygiene among personnel and mandatory declaration of health and whereabouts prior to duty
- j. No physical contact during payment by providing trays for accepting cards and use of alternative modes of payments such as credit and debit card.

3. BARBER SHOPS & SALONS INDUSTRY

- a. Allowed to operate at a maximum of 50% venue capacity
- b. After three weeks, 100% full capacity
- c. Limited to haircutting services only. Manicure, pedicure, facials and eyebrow services are prohibited.
- d. Disinfection of high touch surfaces
- e. Observance of proper personal hygiene among personnel and mandatory declaration of health and whereabouts prior to duty
- f. Health checklist given to customers which includes spaces for name and contact details in case of contact-tracing becomes necessary
- g. No physical contact during payment by providing trays for accepting cards and use of alternative modes of payments such as credit and debit cards
- h. Resumption and continued operations shall be subject to proprietor's compliance with proper health standards set by the DTI.
- i. Compliance shall be assessed by the DTI, DOH, LGU Health Office and/or other deputized organizations.

4. **DINE IN SERVICE IN FOOD RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS** such as supermarkets, grocery stores, and food preparation establishments at a maximum of 50% operational capacity.

SECTION 6. GUIDELINES FOR INTERZONAL & INTRAZONAL MOVEMENT.

1. The transit of all types of cargoes whether by land, air, or sea within and across areas placed under any form of community quarantine, shall be unhampered.
2. Workers in the logistics sector, such as cargo, trucking, courier delivery and port operations shall be allowed with a maximum of five (5) personnel with or without load.
3. Asymptomatic drivers and crew of cargo or service delivery vehicles shall not be required to undergo mandatory fourteen (14) day home quarantine.
4. The PNP shall conduct inspection procedures in checkpoints for the purpose of ensuring that protocols on strict home quarantine are observed.
5. The movement of the following persons shall be permitted:
 - a. Health and emergency frontline services personnel
 - b. Government officials and government frontline personnel, employees
 - c. Duly authorized humanitarian assistance actors or HAAs
 - d. Personnel travelling for medical and humanitarian reasons
 - e. Persons going to the airport for travel abroad
 - f. Returning or repatriated OFWs and other Overseas Filipinos (OFs) returning to their places of residence
 - g. Other persons transported through the efforts of the national government upon the observance of the necessary quarantine protocols and with the concurrence of the receiving LGUs.
 - o Returning LSIs/residents with approved Travel Authority
 - h. Authorized shuttle services
6. Travels of uniformed personnel, government officials and employees for official business shall be supported with corresponding travel authority
7. OFWs, students enrolled abroad and participants accepted in exchange visitor programs, permanent residents of foreign jurisdictions, and stranded foreign nationals, or those leaving for medical and other humanitarian reasons may leave for abroad through any of the airports or seaports in the country but not in countries where travel restrictions are in place

8. Departing passengers may be accompanied by not more than (1) person when travelling to any international port, who shall be allowed to return to his/her point of origin.
9. OFWs and employees of recruitment and placement agencies including their vehicles shall be allowed unhampered transit to and from appropriate government offices for the processing of requirements and facilities such as airports, ferries, bus terminals, etc.
10. Entry and exit of persons in Bauang to and from any GCQ, MGCQ or no community quarantine areas for any purpose other than leisure shall be permitted.

SECTION 7. ENTRY AND EXIT POINTS. Municipal checkpoints located in Barangay Urayong, Ballay and Pagdalagan Sur and all Barangay Control Checkpoints (BCPs) established in the thirty-nine (39) barangays of Bauang, La Union shall continue to operate as follows:

1. **MUNICIPAL CHECKPOINTS** – Controlled by the Philippine National Police in accordance with MGCQ rules and regulations.
2. **BARANGAY CONTROL CHECKPOINTS** – Manned by BPATs/Barangay Council under close supervision by the PNP, especially during curfew hours to ensure no loitering within their areas of jurisdiction.

SECTION 8. REGULATION OF INTOXICATING BEVERAGES. The purchase, retail and consumption of intoxicating beverages such as beer, wine, liquor and the like are strictly regulated as provided under Executive Order No. 2020-028.

SECTION 9. SUPPLEMENTARY GUIDELINES FOR THE OPERATION OF TRICYCLE-FOR-HIRE. Operators and drivers of tricycle for hire shall strictly abide by the rules and regulations for the operation of Tricycle-For-Hire, provided under Executive Order No. 2020-028 with stricter emphasis on the following:

1. Strictly use the outer lane when plying along national road.
2. Strictly follow the fare schedule set with the MIATF/COVID-19 Task Force:

SECTION 10. GUIDELINES FOR PRIVATE TRANSPORTATION. Company shuttles and personal vehicles including but not limited to trucks, motorcycles, vans, bicycle, kolang-kolang and other non-motorized transport, personal mobility devices and other similar means of transport, shall be utilized by authorized persons outside their residences only while observing rules and regulations set by the DOTr and those provided under Executive Order No. 2020-028.

1. Motorcycles, private tricycles, kolong-kolong, bicycles, other non-motorized transport, personal mobility devices and other similar means of transport shall strictly ply along outer lanes when plying along national hi-way.
2. No motorcycle back ride.
3. Private tricycles shall have (1) passenger only
4. Bicycle, kolong-kolong and other non-motorized transport, personal mobility devices and other similar means of transport shall register at the Office of the Municipal Mayor and/or designated office for master listing and issuance of appropriate vehicle identification. Just bring proof of ownership or execute affidavit of ownership provided at point of registration.
5. Strictly follow number coding provided below within the business district area, as applicable:

Government vehicles and other duly authorized private vehicles used for COVID-19 services are exempted from the number coding.

SECTION 11. CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES. All construction projects, public or private, shall be allowed, but with strict compliance to the issued construction safety guidelines for the implementation of infrastructure projects during the COVID-19 pandemic by the DPWH.

All construction projects, whether public or private shall have building permits. No building permit, no construction.

SECTION 12. GUIDELINES FOR LOCALLY STRANDED INDIVIDUALS (LSIs).

1. Register as Locally Stranded Individual using the Barangay Registration Form to be signed by the Barangay Captain. Attach photocopy of any government issued ID.
2. Secure Medical Certification from the Municipal Health Office or the RHU.

3. Submit duly signed Barangay Registration Form and Medical Certificate at the Mayor's Office thru the Administrator's Office for the issuance of LSI Registry and Availability of Travel Certificate.
4. Apply for Travel authority at Bauang Police Station by submitting secured documents from steps 1,2,3.
5. Strictly follow the itinerary indicated in the Travel Authority to avoid being stranded at border checkpoints.

Vehicle transport may be provided to qualified LSIs subject to availability of authorized municipal vehicle. Request for transport shall be filed in advance at the MDRMMO for approval of the Municipal Mayor.

SECTION 13. GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING BAUANG RESIDENTS.

1. Follow guidelines for LSIs provided in the previous section.
2. Coordinate expected return to the Bauang Health Office/RHU.
3. Returning residents shall submit to required mandatory requirements unless underwent the mandatory 14-day quarantine in any government-designated facility.
4. Vehicle transport may be provided to returning Bauang residents subject to availability of authorized municipal vehicle. Request for transport shall be filed in advance at the MDRMMO for approval of the Municipal Mayor.

SECTION 14. MARKET OPERATION. The Municipal Market shall continue to operate in a regulated manner as provided under Executive Order No. 2020-028 to ensure a COVID19-free environment.

1. Market operation is from 5:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday to Saturday.
2. No barangay pass slip, no entry.
3. No work pass, no entry for vendors and helpers.
4. Strictly use entry and exit points.

SECTION 15. OPERATION OF BARANGAY MARKETS OR "TALIPAPA". Barangay Markets shall continue to operate during the duration of the MGCQ as provided under Executive Order No. 2020-028.

Barangay Markets or Talipapas shall be inspected by the Business Health Inspection Team towards its transition as a duly registered barangay-owned or private talipapa in

accordance with the Municipal Revenue Code and other applicable laws and regulations.

SECTION 16. WORK IN GOVERNMENT OFFICES. The Municipal Government shall continue to work under alternative work arrangements during the duration of the MGCQ.

SECTION 17. K-12 CLASSES. The Basic Education Learning Continuity Plan of the Dep Ed shall be adopted. Strict compliance with minimum health standards is strictly mandated for all teachers and Dep-Ed personnel returning to work in accordance with Dep-Ed policies and guidelines.

SECTION 18. PREVAILING CONDITIONS. Herein order is issued with due consideration of the prevailing conditions at the time of its issuance and is without prejudice to any guidelines that may be subsequently issued by the National Government, IATF or any higher authorities.


Should there be any conflict between the national guidelines and the provisions of this Order, the former shall prevail.

SECTION 19. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. Failure to comply with the provisions of this Order shall be dealt with under applicable laws.

SECTION 20. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. All executive orders, advisories, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, which are inconsistent herewith, are hereby revoked, amended and modified accordingly.

SECTION 21. EFFECTIVITY. This order shall take effect as provided and shall be in force and effect during the period of the Modified General Community Quarantine.
